Driving out to Argelague - the roads here completely been rerouted - N-260 has basically been supplanted by a new major freeway. It's SH10 unfinished with lots of roundabouts to avoid the construction of aeropipes! We overshot the exit for Argelague, & had to continue on to S. Jaime de Urca before turning back around.

From the side of the autoroute we saw a tower just 2 south of the road, with Joseph up in the heights adding vertical components. Unbelievable that his building again so close to the road, but obviously he wants to let people know that he's still there, & wants people to come visit what he is doing.

I had thought that we'd be driving below the site as we had last year, so had worn shorts & flip-flops - but now that we'd seen the tower by the roadside we decided to follow a dirt road that ran parallel to it. We parked the car at the top, near a huge culvert/underpass & saw his car. It was somewhat difficult figuring how to get down the cement-covered spillway; it was clear that this was where he was working, since we could see not only the cement additions on the side of the spillway but also several layers of labyrinthine structure to our left as we faded away from the road.

We finally found a path that led thru the labyrinth after a false start or two that ended in dead ends. The incline is very steep and slippery, although it hadn't rained for a couple of days.

He has created water-wheel-type moving components among the fountain's vertical add-ons. Later he told us it would be good to take video so you could hear the sound of the water running & the periodic chinking of certain components filled with water and changed position.

He was happy to see us - immediately climbed down from the tower & wanted to show us all the improvements he'd made to the site. He is very proud of the new work. He was able to get the mesh working on the road to give him free

concrete, & also go help him by using their large tractors or other earth-moving equipment to enlarge the pool & dam up the little river - it looks really nice.

Down below and further West of the fountain there are three narrow paths leading from the lower road toward the cliffs ~~and~~ just to the left of the freeway. One enters the ledge to a short series of caves that have completely chiseled out of the rock. The road signs were going to cover it up completely. Even though they were going to cover it up completely, it was because the road had been placed too close to the cliff, & therefore was unstable. If it had been placed 50 feet further to the north, the road would have been made stable and most importantly, it would have been away from the original site of the labyrinth & there, so he would have had to use the road that construction at all.

There are two & two of concrete boulders that have been placed along the lower road as reinforcement signs, to the intersection of the (new?) alcalle they left a space open for the three panels, rather than covering them up and prohibiting access to the cave.

We picked our way into the cave - he went first, then Sam. Here we - it is very close in there, & no admonition have been put in yet. He sounded a horn & as I passed by, yelled & made me jump out of my skin. He thought it was hysterically funny. We all laughed. He said he was going to put a mirror to scare people, but also chuckled that he didn't need a mirror if he were there to scare people himself.

Further still down the road uses the site where he'd built the little museum/cemetery. One boulder from the road crew had come crashing down off the side, & still lay in the middle of

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one of the paths. He had earlier laid a fence one of the labyrinthine areas, but after Sam helped, he took it up because there's a sun there. In this section he still has crazy some of the walls, etc. that had been with him - underground - as well as the little signs he set up describing his labours. The barrel is also the one he gets inside & then jumps up to scare & we walked back along the lower road where he's much better condition than before - he wanted to see the shape of the Jones from that distance. He'd used part of a tower fan before - the only that remained from the construction earlier had He said that in some ways the security of road is the need to take the structures down, but they had been left because new materials available. It had remained. So he can completely get up on to it & go around. That's all any orientation towards the sky - that's either the best, but some good things did in of his bid to make the changes.

Near the lower part of the fountain he has also a few "sunshines" (the word) - vertical pins made out of twisted steel form implements of a device that rotates around a single axle. They several (6?) faces. A bird has made a nest on top - Sam hoped that it would get sick & spin it around.

By working on the tower by the road it is that he wants to announce to potential clients it is still working. Some people thought he was said.

I gave him copies of the Folk Art magazine. He was pleased, & also said that his tour is more now that I could have another 1/4 of a year. I told him I was ready to do that. He silently turned 70 - we mentioned Dinsmore worked till he was just 70 days old with S. They'd have to do a book just in him, but not that's a hundred years old.

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interesting that he referred to the original components with faces as "sculptures" but not any of the rest of the construction.

Said he's now often coming back to work for the in the afternoons as well, whereas before he mostly only worked in the mornings. (Although he had worked afternoons/evenings during certain times of the year before as well).

We went in mid-afternoon - he was just there, but had obviously been continuing to work on the tower near the freeway. It seemed to be at least one level higher; we had then started to create the curved "roof" that he had said last week he was going to install - one loop of willow had been installed, as well as a blue/white flag rising from the top, flying high over the tower & alerting the passersby on the autoroute that he was still alive & working.

We'd gone out to see Salas or Morde up to Begur/Camprodon yesterday, both for seeing the tall tower by the side of the road Joseph had been working on - tried to take while speeding by the freeway.

So, went over this morning and found him at work on the base of another yet a few meters away from the first. He stopped when he saw me, told me he had left because he hadn't seen us. I told we'd stopped by and he wasn't there - he must've been in Girona or ...

He took me up to the tall tower - it was, he said - altho' later he also said that, to cap it off better with something. He blue/white Catalan flag on the south side 2 meters from the top - he said he'd had top but his daughter Montse made him take it down because she thought it called too much attention so it'd get into trouble if she had to take it down. His well aware you can see it from the road - & happy because then people will see it & know he's still working.

He took me into the tower & made me all the way to the very top level - he missed some good shots on the other structures I hadn't gone all the way up - I would've. the penultimate level - the little passageway levels were so small that I had to fit,

shoulders enough on a diagonal, especially carrying one big camera over each shoulder. As I was on the penultimate level he had stayed on the level below, since 2 people couldn't fit side by side on the upper two levels he shook the structure violently to show me how strong it was (!!). I figured while I was climbing to the top that I suppose lying on an any environment would be an appropriate death, if now was when I had to go!

This tower is very tall - the tallest he'd built from bottom to top, although he said that the ones in the old structures might have been taller since they were built on top of the trees.

He has received a bunch of planed lumber from the guys who'd been working on the autoramas so he is using these both as flooring - in the case of the first tall tower - and as supports base for this next large tower he is just now starting to build.

We walked on back to the cement fountain area - he's waiting for rain, he says, so that the various pools will fill up and spill over into each other nicely.

He remarked again how he is building to take advantage of the materials that he has. If they hadn't cut the freeway and the guys hadn't given him the concrete, he wouldn't have dove the major piece he'd done on that site, & ditto with the wood banking that he'd just received -

(He'd mentioned last time - I don't remember if I'd noted it down at the time) that finding the supple branches that he'd used before on the abutments were becoming harder to find, because

with all of the changes the universe has in big new concrete near the spring, etc - it changed the course of the river, & now he finds no place to get them, and in the places he goes they didn't exist anymore). Note that may have been exacerbated by the fact he harvested all of the papaya trees in directly below the site.

As we walked through & around the four smaller sites, he said that he was basically done ~~here~~ - smaller site, so he had to work tighter with greater precision. He did say, tho, that has a couple of other things that he'd like to do like some of the other sculptures he has at the top & bottom of the area.

For the moment he is concentrating on second tower, and then will come back to fountain area and ~~look at~~ add more & labyrinthine tunnels, connecting some of his separate pieces. He didn't mention anything about the "museum/mausoleum" down or the other small "mirador" tower he'd between the two sites.

A bit on him had been aired "about month ago" on TV3 - we'd been by Hector's dad & I'll have to try to find him. This is another way that people finding out he's still working.

He said again that this is the thing he started building constructions at the

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he is working on a second tower (which is probably won't be as tall as the first) - taking advantage of the wood he scavenged from the astoria construction: the floors & some stairs are now of the planks of wood. He will go up a bit more, & then perhaps put a little "casita" tree house up in the tallest branches.

He said when I come back in the spring there will certainly be changes - perhaps they'll make him take the large tower down, or perhaps it'll still all <sup>be</sup> there. He says his daughter & son-in-law have turned against him now - he's "SOLO" - they are strongly against him building the towers that you can see from the road, because they're afraid that someone will come out & get hurt.

I asked if he'd spoken to the alcaldesa about it, & he said no.

He wants people to see his work - it's harder for people to stop now, because of the astoria - before people could just sweep off the road, but now they can't figure out how to get here. But one will see & he will tell another & another -

at one point he said that he one of people come - he was sorry for himself. he never got fired, & enjoyed it. But then he formed a football team ~~the~~ of people don't go watch the game, it's zero. Some MM: zero.
