We just received a phone call from Wayne & LouElla Naegele, owners of the Garden of Eden, who told us that the property is for sale. Of course we hope that a sympathetic buyer who would responsibly maintain the site can be found.

The Maegeles have respected the site while it has been in their charge. The Garden of Eden is a splendid site known all over the world. It draws over 20,000 tourists each year to Lucas and it would be a great loss to the state if it was destroyed or turned into a Disneyland by people less sensitive than the current owners.

In New Mexico the U.S. Park Service took over another National Register Monument, "Pop" Shaffer's Hotel, for their local headquarters, thereby protecting the hotel from the buildozers. Shy of a private, sympathetic buyer who would maintain the site, we hope that the town of Lucas or the Federal or State government would take an interest in this site. Candidly speaking, we are at a loss of what we can do from this distance and hoped that you could use your good offices to protect this Kansas treasure.
