

The Orange Show is considered one of the finest examples of environmental folk art in the United States. It is one man's dream made wonderfully real in concrete, tile and brick. Jeff McKissack, a Houston postman, dedicated 25 years of his life to the conception and creation of this monument to the orange and his personal philosophy of good health through hard work and nutrition. The Foundation was established six years ago, after McKissack's death, to preserve and operate The Show as a cultural and educational resource for the City of Houston. Today, it is visited by thousands each year and is the site of tours and special events for children and adults.
