To Whom It May Concern:

As a condition of our donation of California Historical Landmark #939 also known as John Ehn's Old Trappers Boothill, we wish to make the following requests:

1. We want the "Boothill" to be placed on a site where it will remain for an extended period of time, hopefully the lifetime of the statues and artifacts.
2. In the event the "Boothill" has to be moved our first choice is that it be moved to another secure site within your facility.
3. In the event the Boothill can no longer remain at your facility a diligent effort must be made to contact members of the Ehn family or their heirs so that they can find a new site for the Boothill. A constantly updated list will be provided to you of the names and addresses of the family.
4. Under no circumstances is the Boothill to be destroyed or disposed of unless every effort has been made to contact the donors. If they are unavailable a sincere, diligent effort must be made to find a safe new home for the Boothill. As a last resort the artifacts can be separated and given to various Folk Art museums, etc. This should be handled by the S.P.A.C.E.S organization if they are still in existence.
5. Although the Boothill needs little care, periodic maintenance is to be made to preserve their appearance and prevent deterioration.

Our basic desire is for the artwork of our father and it's Historical Landmark be preserved on a secure long term site where it may be enjoyed by as many people as possible. In this way his dream and memory will continue.
