During 1954 (Marian Year), I made pilgrimages to various shrines, including one to St. Anne's de Be Preu. Rocks and shells were gathered from the Jesuit Shrine at Auersville, New York, the Adirondack Mountains Fort Ticondaroga, Mt. Royal, Montreal, the St. Lawrence River, Military academy of Canada, Cap de Madeline and Our Lady Loures Grotto at Rigued, Canada. Our trip was highlighted by visiting historical and religious places of interest. We also gathered rocks at St. Anne's, some a the Toly Stairs, and one at the 14th. Outdoor Station. I purchased a 18 inch Statue at St. Anne's, of the Blessed Virgin, and decided to make a Grotto to house the Statue, of all the rocks we had gathered on our trip. There are several rocks included in this shrine that I received from bo s in service, one with a replica of a cross is from Goose Bay Canada, while another one is from Christ the King Campus, Cambridge, England that my son picked up when he was stationed there.
