So far I have only been able to find one person who can give a fair appraisal on the doll - but I have a number of leads. As I mentioned when we met, an appraisor needs a total inventory before a real judgement can be made. So.....

1. Every doll needs to be identified - each needs a number and their named (if Calvin named them).
2. Measurments (height)
3. Description - do they move? what are they wearing? jewerly, hat, name tag?
4. Condition - Fine-Good-Poor (combination of surface paint cracks if any, weathered, broken, clothing, etc).
5. Location on site (Doll Theater, out side in Windmill #1, etc).


Start with the dolls in the theater, then those immediately outside. Just keep groups together and in numerical order. Then the signs.

The person I talked to felt the things still on the site are not worth anything and the value of the other pieces will vary considerably. A definite price is hard to assess without touching everything.
