Dear Terry:

It was a pleasure to talk with you yesterday and finalize plans for a screening of the Grandma Prisbrey film at the Woman's Building. I am very excited about being involved with your 10th Anniversary Celebration and am looking forward to sharing the creativity of such an amazing woman with your organization. As you requested, I am enclosing a copy of the TAPA brochure and some history of the Bottle Village and the film. If you need any other information, please let me know.

The entire program will last about 35 to 40 minutes. I would like to introduce the film with a few comments about Grandma, the Village and the filming. The film will last 28 minutes after which I would like to close with some brief remarks about the preservation efforts. Brochures describing TAPA will be available, as well as a guest book for people interested in joining TAPA's mailing list. I will also be happy to answer any questions that people may have.

The only supplies I will need are a 16mm projector and a screen. Also a small table to hold the brochures and guest book would be nice. As we discussed, it may be inappropriate to bombard your guests with requests for money. I would prefer to have your organization guarantee the \$40 rental fee and simply suggest to viewers where they can send donations if they would like to support the preservation of the Bottle Village.

I will give you a call in the middle of September to confirm the screening on October 2, 1983 at 2:00pm at the Woman's Building. Again, thank you very much for the opportunity to share our preservation efforts with your organization. I am looking forward to meeting you.
