Since McKissack's death in 1980, the Show is owned and operated by a not-for-profit foundation.

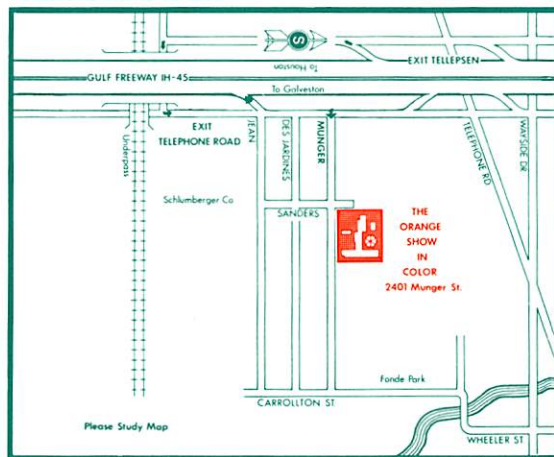

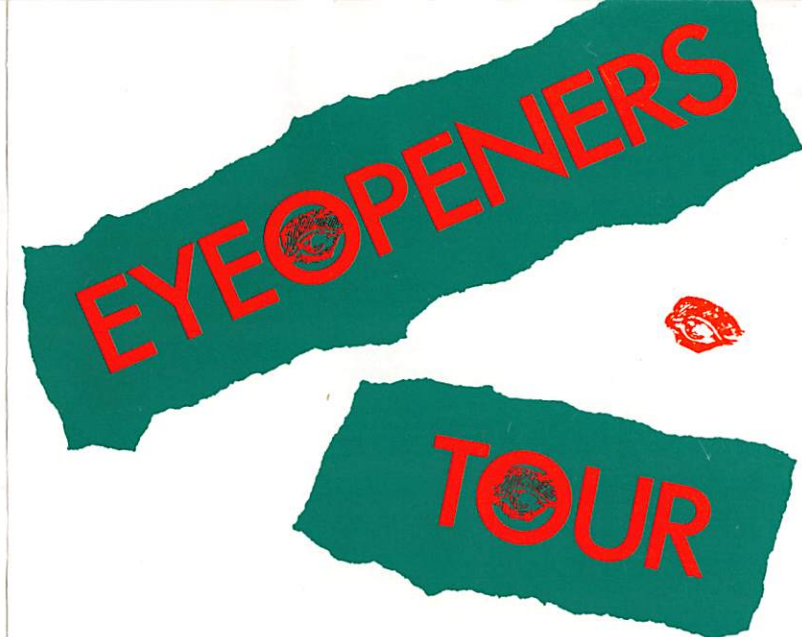
