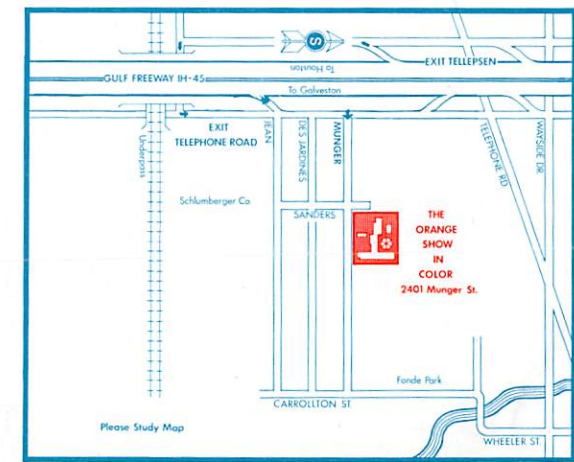

THE ORANGE SHOW

The Orange Show is one man's monument to the fruit he loved most. Jeff McKissack, working alone over a 25 year period, built this multi-level structure across the street from his own house in Houston's East End. The Orange Show was built with found objects, in particular masonry block, tiles, the wheels and seats of farm equipment and countless other items. With a visionary mind and a dedicated hand, he transformed these scrap materials into elaborate sculptures, displays, doorways, gates and railings. Whimsical mosaic messages embedded in plaster walls throughout The Show echo McKissack's personal philosophy.
